35. Honorary Freedom of the Town

[Section 249\(5\) of the Local Government Act 1972](#) allows a relevant authority, such as Wantage Town Council, to admit to be honorary freemen or honorary freewomen of the place or area for which it is the authority:

- (a) persons of distinction, and
- (b) persons who have, in the opinion of the authority, rendered eminent services to that place or area.

This requires a resolution passed by not less than two thirds of the members voting on it at a meeting of the Council, specially convened for the purpose and where notice of the object of the meeting has been given.

The Town Mayor, Councillor Major Jim Sibbald, will move the following motion at the Council Meeting:

That in accordance with the provisions of Section 249 of the Local Government Act 1972 the Council admit The Reverend Canon Peter Turbitt, being a person of distinction, in recognition for the thirty years of valuable and devoted services rendered as the Parish Priest to the community of Wantage.
