Find a WARM welcome at your local library

You'll get a warm welcome in our libraries. Given steeply rising energy bills, it is anticipated that many residents will feel they are not able to heat their homes adequately this winter.

The county council will offer warm places across the winter – with the focus on its libraries network.

Libraries will be offered as welcoming and warm places for people to spend time, helping with isolation, loneliness and mental wellbeing as well as warmth. Everyone is welcome – and you'll have access to the internet and computers as well as our wide range of books and audio books.

There is also a plan to offer a grants

scheme for community venues to contribute to their energy costs with the proviso that they would open for a set time each week.

This will support existing activities (stay and play schemes, lunch clubs etc) as well as encouraging new initiatives. There will be a £100,000 fund available for organisations to bid for.

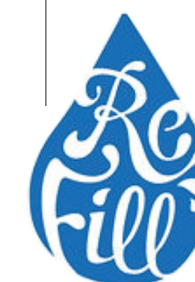
Refurbishments around the town

* The parking area within the market square has been resurfaced to ensure that the potholes that had developed over time were made safe.

* The white lining has been refreshed and the bollards and litter bins surrounding King Alfred's statue have been painted.

* The opportunity to create two disabled parking spaces was considered and implemented. They are easily visible and are marked in yellow in the central parking area opposite Coral Bookmakers.

* The Town Council has also added new waste bins at the Cemetery.



Look out for the National Refill stickers!

The national Refill scheme has started in Wantage and the objective is to reduce the use of single-use plastic water bottles by creating a network of Refill 'stations' across the town to make it easy for people to refill their water bottle, rather than buying a new one.

Local cafés, bars, restaurants, pubs, museums and galleries that join the Refill scheme get a blue Refill sticker on their window and are plotted on the Refill app. The Beacon, Wantage has already been operating this scheme for some time.

The Refill scheme is supported by Wantage Town Council, local MPs, and the Lord-Lieutenant of Oxfordshire.
